What Is A VSL?

Video Sales Letter

- Sales Copy In A Video Format With Voice.
 - ✓ The Common Format Is To Use PowerPoint Presentations And Record With Video Screen-Capture Software.

However, As Seen In The Previous Lesson, Other Common Types of Video Are “White Board” and “Explainer” Videos.

Why Are They Effective?

- Because They Deliver The Important Information And Benefits Of The Product To The Prospective Customer In A “Spoon Fed” Method Ensuring They Do Not Miss Critical Info That Ultimately Benefits Them And Makes Them Want To Buy.

Video Is Also An “Entertaining”/Less Boring Way To Deliver A Message And Can Trigger Emotion Through Voice Inflections, Sound, Visual Images, Etc.

What's Needed?

Sales Copy / Script.

Final Video In **MP4 Format**. Camtasia Can Render To This Format. Or You Can Use A Free Tool Like [Handbrake.fr](https://handbrake.fr) To Convert Non-MP4 Video Into This Format.

- ✓ **Video Player** (Such As JW Player Or Flow Player) To Display The Video On Your Web Page. Or Alternatively, Use A Service Like [EasyVideoSuite.com](https://easysuites.com) or [Wistia.com](https://wistia.com) For Managing Videos, Players, Auto-Conversion To Web Ready Format.
